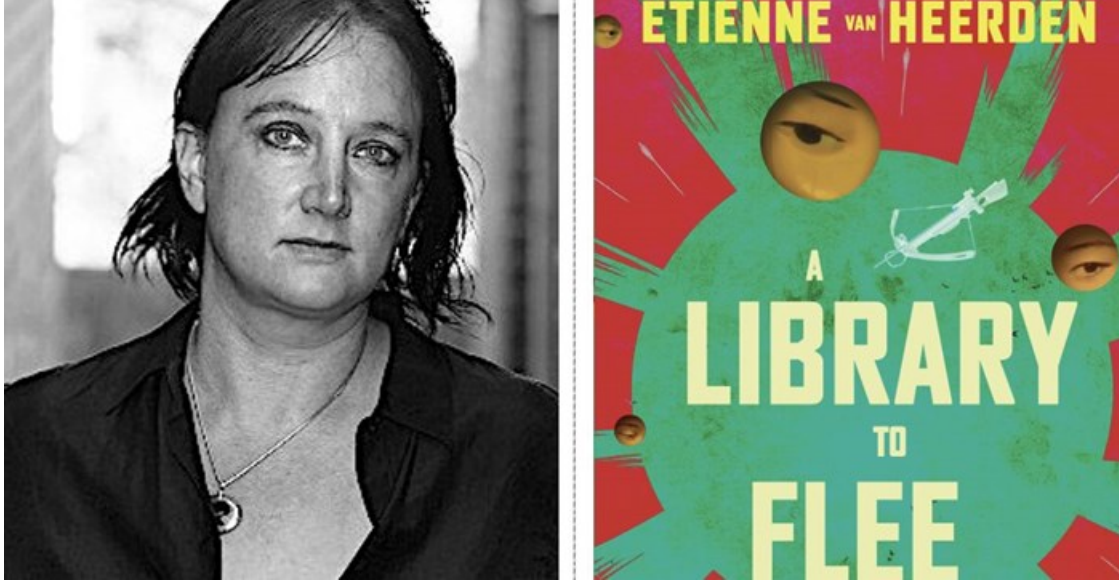


Henrietta Rose-Innes named winner of UJ Prize for Translation

The University of Johannesburg (UJ) has announced the winner of the UJ Prize for Translation.

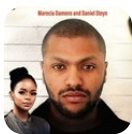


Henrietta Rose-Innes has won the winner of the 2023 UJ Prize for Translation. Source: Supplied.
