

The news making headlines on social media

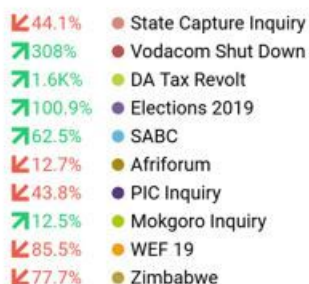
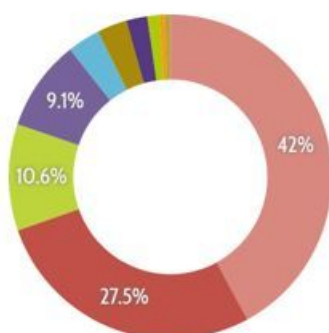
